Challenges faced by women today

- **Gender Bias:** Kenya's technology industry being a male-dominated, it has often led to gender bias against women,
- Limited Access to Funding: Women in the technology sector in Kenya often need help securing funding for their ventures. Investors may be biased towards male-led businesses less likely to take women's ideas more seriously.
- Lack of Support Networks: Women in the technology sector may need access to the same support networks as their male counterparts. Such as mentorship programs, networking events, and other opportunities to help them build their careers.
- Lack of Role Models: Seeing few visible role models for women in the Kenyan technology industry, has and is still a demotivating factor for women looking to build careers in this sector.


Steps taken to redresses to this challenges include:



- Women in Tech Kenya is to empower, uplift, and inspire women in technology across Kenya by fostering an inclusive and supportive environment.


